My Brother Knights, Families, and Friends,



### **Your Fraternal Insurance Agent's Report**

April is Autism Awareness month and I'd bet each one of us probably knows someone with autism; I know I do. The young lady I know is challenged both physically and mentally. The Autism Speaks website (www.autismspeaks.org) is a wealth of information. Autism is not one disorder, it is actually called autism spectrum disorder or ASD because there is a broad range, a spectrum, from very mild to very severe characteristics.

Some with very mild characteristics can function in society quite well and hold responsible jobs. At the other end of the spectrum may be the person who is nonverbal, is challenged physically and may engage in nearly constant repetitive behaviors. Those with these more severe issues may need lots of support from family, friends and social service agencies. The Autism Speaks website says "autism affects an estimated 1 in 59 children in the United States today."

Nobody seems to know what causes autism and the manifestations vary so widely that there is no real cure. Often the best that can be done is try to treat symptoms and help the individual cope with strengths and challenges faced. Because some of the symptoms or indicators often appear at a young age, before age 3, doctors have found that early diagnosis and intervention is the best course of action. With this early intervention, many individuals can be helped to improve the quality of their lives. As we become more and more aware of the disorder you may know a member who is dealing with this himself or perhaps one of his family members has it. Your support, empathy and concern are usually well-received. It's an opportunity to show Christ's love to a neighbor. I encourage you to find out more on the website for Autism Speaks.

I can't end this message without wishing all of you a very Blessed Easter! It's celebrated in the Latin Church on April 12 this year. What a wondrous time in our liturgical year! While we celebrate Jesus' victory over death and his glorious Resurrection, we remember that the raising from the dead came after humiliating abuse and an agonizing death. When I pray the rosary, I try to meditate on a particular decade by placing myself in that decade's scene. How would I, a follower of Jesus, have reacted to his crucifixion? At the cross like John, or scared and hidden away with rest of the disciples? Would I have been brave enough? Then at the first Glorious Mystery, there at the tomb, stunned in awe of the mighty power of the Resurrection. What a mighty God we have! May each of you and your families experience the joy of this Easter season!

### **Love in the Time of Coronavirus**

Will isolation lead some to drift from the path of Christ: the ultimate embodiment of love? It's a question our chaplain Msgr. Jim Forsen pondered when people were told to begin distancing themselves from one another, and even avoid Church at the beginning of the current pandemic emergency. "The devil makes work for idle hands to do," as St. Jerome said, so will separation cause us to succumb to the temptation of sloth, or bring out our better angels?

Widespread limitations on freedom accompanying Coronavirus constitutes the first shared crisis suffered by all Americans since World War II. It affects everyone, whereas the Vietnam War and 9/11 impacted only segments of society. We are truly in this one together and so far the response has been largely positive. Sure, there's been greed in the form of hoarding, but so much good as well. People have come together in ways not seen in ages. While children play outside their homes, laughing and chalking sidewalks under watchful eyes of parents chatting with neighbors, God's better angels carry on in spite of a barrage of doom and gloom on television.

It takes effort: Christ-inspired effort to get through a crisis intact. People helping families, helping neighbors help others. Churches and other organizations have set-up volunteer networks to contact and assist shut-ins with errands and buying groceries. The American Legion calls it "Buddy Checks." Ministerial workarounds, including livestreaming Mass, email blasts and telephonic outreach ensure continuity and cohesiveness in a time of social distancing. Our Church is a touchstone and rock of stability that serves as a conduit of Christ's love, but only with our assistance - helping others.

When my own mom was in the final year of life, with a weakened immune system brought on by leukemia, she was forced to stop attending Mass to avoid contact with sick people. Rather than use her condition to withdraw from the Lord, she instead spent her time in furtherance of His master plan.

### ARCHDIOCESE LAUNCHES HOTLINE TO SERVE THE HOMEBOUND IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY AND THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

--- New service "Hearts to Serve" will include grocery and medicine delivery to brothers and sisters in need---

In the midst of the crisis due to COVID-19 (coronavirus) generating increased needs from certain segments of the community, the Office of Life, Justice and Peace of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, in partnership with St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Knights of Columbus will launch on Tuesday, March 24, *Hearts to Serve*, a hotline in support to all of those in need, especially the elderly, homebound, and pregnant women. The joint effort answers the call of Pope Francis and of Archbishop José H. Gomez, to be missionary disciples.

"In this unprecedented time of uncertainty and sacrifice, we see wonderful acts of kindness and mercy emerging," said Kathleen Domingo, senior director of the Archdiocese's Office of Life, Justice and Peace. "Hearts to Serve invites Catholies from every walk of life to join an effort of prayer and service for those most in need now. Together, we can nourish our faith and offer real comfort to our brothers and sisters. When once again we are able to gather in person, our community will be stronger for it."

Those in need of food or supplies can call the hotline at 855-423-6780 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. A Catholic community of volunteers will be ready to help with essential needs. They will connect callers with local resources for food and other household necessities. The services that will be provided include: grocery or medicine delivery to homes, provision of food and other necessities from local food pantries to those that might not be able to afford it at this time.

"The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Council of Los Angeles, is here to serve the poor and those living on the margins," said David Garcia, executive director of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. "In this time of uncertainty, the Society is committed to collaborating with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in its efforts to mobilize Catholics to serve the neediest in our community. As you can imagine, due to the current crisis, our parish-based chapters of volunteers, which we call Conferences of Charity, have seen an increase in calls for assistance. We will do our best to assist the Archdiocese's outreach endeavors to help people in need."

To meet increased needs from the diverse communities served in the Archdiocese, *Hearts to Serve* is providing those looking to help others during the pandemic with the following volunteer opportunities:

- Volunteer to answer calls on the hotline. Training will be provided. Can be done from your own home.
- Volunteer to deliver food and household items to the homebound. Must be under 60 years of age, have a current
  drivers' license, auto insurance and use of a vehicle.
- Collect items to stock parish-based food pantries. In addition to nonperishable food items, fresh produce and bread, meat, and baby items, such as diapers and formula are appreciated.
- Volunteer at a parish-based food pantry. Hours to be determined.
